Epiphany House

Swishing is the easy way to update your wardrobe! It's guilt free shopping and it's great for the environment.

How it works

Each person must bring at least one small bag of quality clothing, shoes or accessories to take part. As you arrive your bag of clothing will be emptied, you will then be able to refill this bag with new-to-you clothing. We may weigh the contents but this will be so we can record the amount of textiles that we have helped to be reused.

- There is no strict maximum or minimum limit on what you should bring.
- There will be a range of clothing for you to swap including women, men's and children's clothing, accessories and shoes.
- Nightwear, swimwear and underwear including socks cannot be accepted due to hygiene reasons.
- This works better when everyone brings good, clean clothing in to swish, therefore it is best if items are in a good condition – something that has shrunk, is stained or is beyond repairing (e.g. missing buttons, broken zips, loose sequins or beading, rips, tears, fabric pulls or holes, disintegrating seams or hems) are not really suitable. If you want it fixed, take it to the repair station and see if we can help you out.

When the Swish doors open clothes can be taken on a first come first served basis – so please be nice, we have a few hours here so look at it as a social event, stay for tea, have a chat and show off your new best finds.

We will have changing rooms and there will be tea, coffee and snacks for sale on the day.

Also on offer will be a repair service where for a small donation basic repairs will be made so you can get some extra life out of your most loved clothing or where slight adjustments and additions can be made to bring a new lease of life to your old clothing.

The £1 entrance fee will help us to cover the cost of running the event. Any surplus will go back into the community, supporting TeX—Textiles with a Difference and The Epiphany Trust, the charitable trust which runs Epiphany House.
